If you're looking for a label maker that is easy to use, offers connectivity options, and is compatible with labels of different widths, consider the DYMO LabelManager 280 Rechargeable Portable Label Maker. This model offers a computer-style qwerty keyboard to help you quickly make and print labels directly from the unit. You can also connect it to a computer using the included USB cable. Once connected, you can use the DYMO software to choose from more than 20 text formatting options and add more than 200 symbols or images to your labels.

The DYMO LabelManager 280 Rechargeable Portable Label Maker is powered by a rechargeable lithium-ion battery. It's compatible with DYMO labels of varying widths (1/4-inch, 3/8-inch, and 1/2-inch) to aid with your organizational needs. After printing a label, use the manual cutter to remove it from the unit, and then peel it off to stick on the desired item.

# **DYMO Junior Home Embossing Label Maker** »

The DYMO Junior Home Embossing Label Maker is an economically priced option. Unlike the other models on our list that print the labels you create, this model uses an embossing system to imprint your desired text onto a label strip. The rotary-style keyboard is intuitive – though a bit more time-consuming – to use. Simply turn the dial until the desired letter is lined up

with the arrow, and then click it down. Repeat until the text is complete, and then line up the dial with the scissors icon to manually cut the tape.

This model, which operates without the use of any batteries or cables, is a lightweight and portable option. You won't need to worry about replacing any batteries or having to let them charge. The Junior Home Embossing Label Maker is only compatible with 9-millimeter tape, which DYMO offers in blue, green, red, and black.

The Brother P-touch PTD210BP is an appealing option to consider. Eryn Donaldson, founder and CEO of The Model Home, selected this as her top recommendation. She says, "It's compact, so you can toss it in your bag if you need to label stuff on the fly. Plus, it runs on batteries or plugs into the wall." As a power source, the unit requires either six AAA batteries or an alternating current (AC) adapter, both of which are sold separately.

"The interface is super user-friendly, and you can customize your labels with different fonts and styles in no time," Donaldson says. The associate editor for Home Goods in 360 Reviews, Kayla Randolph, owns this model and loves the variety of fonts, borders, and symbols that really let you add personality

to your labels. Donaldson adds that this model "even has shortcut keys for quick access to common labels and templates. Basically, it's reliable, easy to use, and gives you lots of options to play around with."

You can use the Phomemo M02 Portable Printer for more than just making labels. The Bluetooth thermal printer can also print stickers, photographs, lists, and more. It connects with the Phomemo app, wherein you can choose from different fonts, themes, and filter effects. It's compatible with several types of paper, including colored, transparent, and semitransparent. Phomemo even offers a special type of paper that'll print in blue.

Compact in size, this portable printer weighs less than 1 pound and is only about 2 inches tall with a width and depth of around 4 inches. It's available in five color options, including green, pink, purple, white, and black.

The Brother P-touch Cube Plus makes it easy to print labels from a smartphone, computer, or tablet. It connects wirelessly with these devices via Bluetooth, allowing you to customize your labels to match your exact specifications and preferences. There are three different applications that are compatible with the printer, each offering different design and customization options. These include the Brother iPrint&Label app and the P-touch Design&Print2 app for smartphones and tablets and the P-touch Editor software for desktop and laptop computers.

This label maker features a built-in lithium-ion battery. It's compatible with Brother P-touch TZe label tapes up to 1 inch wide, which gives you flexibility with what you'll be able to label with it. Each purchase includes two label tape rolls (a 0.94-inch-by-13.1-foot Black Print on White Starter Label Tape

and a 0.94-inch-by-6.5-foot Black Print on Premium Glitter Gold Starter Label Tape).

### The Bottom Line

The best label maker for you will depend on your labeling needs, preferences regarding how you'll create the labels (with the label maker itself or through a connected computer or smartphone app), and budget. We selected the DYMO LabelManager 280 Rechargeable Portable Label Maker as our top pick. We like that it features a computer-style qwerty keyboard and how you can connect it to a computer for a wider selection of fonts and images. This model is portable and comfortable to hold in your hand.

# **Things To Consider When Buying Label Makers**

**Size:** As you shop for a new label maker, size is one factor that you'll want to consider. First, keep the overall size of each model in mind as you think about how

you plan on using the label maker. Consider whether you'll be using it only at home or in the office or if you want something with a more compact and portable design that'll be easy to bring with you to other locations.

Beyond the size of the unit itself, consider the size of the screen, if it has one. If you'll be previewing the labels on the screen or using it to select different fonts or templates, you'll want one that's large enough to see clearly. This may be especially important for label makers that don't have the capabilities to connect with a computer, as you'll be designing all of your labels on the screen, not on your PC.

Finally, also consider the size(s) of the labels that you can make with the machine. Some models are compatible with labels of different sizes, while others may only make a single size. Think about what you want to be able to label, and choose a model that's compatible with appropriately sized labels.

Batteries and Charging: While some label makers come with a USB cable or an AC adapter (or are compatible with one that you can purchase separately), most are battery-powered. However, you'll notice that some use alkaline batteries, while others have rechargeable lithium-ion batteries. There are pros and cons for each battery type that you'll need to weigh when deciding which is the right choice for you.

If you choose a model that's powered by AA, AAA, or other alkaline batteries, you'll need to make sure that you have a spare set of batteries on hand to replace them when they die. You'll also have to account for the added cost of purchasing new batteries. However, as long as you have spare batteries available, you won't have to worry about stopping in the middle of a labeling project to let a battery charge.

Label makers with a lithium-ion battery may save you money in the long run since you won't need to purchase replacement batteries. Many last for several hours on a single charge, allowing you to label many items at the same time. However, when the battery runs out, you'll have to stop what you're doing and give it time to recharge.

**Interface:** A user-friendly interface is a must when choosing a label maker. Donaldson says, "Look for one that's easy to navigate. You don't want to spend ages figuring out how to make a simple label!"

Consider the type of keyboard that the label maker uses (or if it connects to a computer so you can use a standard keyboard to create your labels). Nonconnected models may have a rotary keyboard that you'll need to turn to spell out words. Others

may have a qwerty keyboard, which is the same layout as what you'll find on a standard keyboard for a computer. This style can be easier to use because you'll likely be familiar with where the keys are positioned. Some label makers have an alphabet-style keyboard where the keys are in alphabetical order.

Beyond the keyboard layout, consider the other functions of each unit. How do you change the font or layout of the label? How do you print the finished labels? Think about how easy these and other tasks will be.

**Customization Options:** Customization varies between label makers. While some don't allow you to change the font or its size, others offer multiple font options. You can even select the size of the font and choose from bold or italic choices with some models. If you want your labels to stand out or match a certain theme, then you may want to prioritize choosing a label maker that offers a wide range of customization options.

In addition to the ability to choose from different fonts, some label makers also offer different graphics or symbols. With these, you can make your labels more unique and help them better fit the purpose you have in mind.

**Special Features:** While some label makers are more basic, others offer additional features that may make them a better fit for your needs. We already discussed how some models allow you to customize the font or add images or symbols to your labels. Additionally, some label makers can also print bar codes. If you're looking for a label maker to use for a retail store, then this might be a feature you're interested in since it can assist with faster customer checkouts. Bluetooth label makers are more likely to offer this feature. Donaldson says, "If you like tech-savvy gadgets, consider if you want one that can connect to your computer or phone for extra features."

Another feature that you might want to look for is storage. If you think you'll want to print the same label(s) again in the future, then having a label maker with a memory function can prevent you from having to recreate the same label every time you need it. Just be sure to check how many label designs can be stored. Some may only be able to save a few dozen, while others may have a storage capacity of closer to 100.

**Recurring Costs:** As you're shopping for the best label maker, you're likely comparing the prices of each model. And while this is important, it isn't the only thing you'll want to consider when thinking about how much money you'll end up spending. Label

makers come with recurring costs. For instance, you'll need to purchase more label tape or paper to keep printing new labels. However, the cost of these supplies can vary by manufacturer. Before finalizing your decision about which model you want to buy, do some comparison shopping to see what you can expect to spend when you need to purchase more paper for your unit.

### How We Chose the Best Label Makers

To help us curate our list of the best label makers, we reached out to two professional organizers: Eryn Donaldson, founder and CEO of The Model Home, and Betsy Fein, president of Clutterbusters. In addition to considering the insight and recommendations of these two experts, we considered the information shared by both everyday customers and professional reviewers, aiming to select label makers with a range of functions and features available to suit different budgets.
