The Stokke Tripp Trapp High Chair offers an adjustable design, allowing it to adapt to the needs of babies, toddlers, and children. The chair's design is ideal for parents who want their babies to learn to feed themselves. Kim Grenawitzke, an occupational therapist with Solid Starts, a resource for introducing solid foods to babies, explains, "If you want to let your baby feed themselves, look for a high chair with a completely upright seat, adjustable footrest, and removable tray so that baby can join you at the table." The Stokke Tripp Trapp meets all of these criteria, keeping babies and toddlers in an ergonomic position.

This high chair is crafted from responsibly sourced beech and oak wood. It's available in 15 different solid colors, including White, Black, Walnut, Serene Pink, Fjord Blue, and Sunflower Yellow. It can even be used with newborn babies. Add the Newborn Bundle to your purchase (available for an additional \$50) to be able to position infants for bottle feeding or spending time around the table with the rest of the family. A high chair cushion and tray can also be added to your purchase for an additional \$100.

If you're on a tighter budget or are looking for a spare high chair to have when your child is at a family member's or caregiver's home, the IKEA Antilop High Chair might be the right fit for you. At just under \$20, this is the least expensive option on our list, costing just a fraction of some of the more expensive models. The Antilop High Chair is designed to be easy to disassemble, making it possible to bring it with you when traveling or even to a restaurant. The removable tray has a raised edge to minimize messes and keep babies from pushing their food onto the floor.

While this high chair doesn't offer as high of a weight limit as some of the other models on our list, it can support babies and toddlers up to 33 pounds. The absence of cushions or seat pads makes it easier to wipe it clean after your baby enjoys their meal.

Those with more limited space might want to take a look at the Fisher-Price Baby SpaceSaver High Chair. Compared to other stand-alone models, this high chair is designed to be secured to a standard dining chair, minimizing the amount of space it'll take up in a kitchen or dining room. Simply use the integrated straps to connect it to a standard chair, and it'll be ready for your baby to sit in. Choose from three adjustable recline positions for bottle-feeding or eating solid foods.

The Fisher-Price Baby SpaceSaver High Chair features a large, wrap-around tray that offers plenty of space to hold food for your little one. The tray can be easily removed using just one hand, and both the tray and liner are dishwasher-safe. As the baby gets older, you can remove the tray and

convert the chair into a booster seat so that your little one can sit directly at the table with the rest of the family. It can support up to 50 pounds. Fisher-Price offers eight machine-washable seat cover choices for this model, all of which feature fun designs.

The design of the Inglesina Fast Table Chair makes it ideal for parents and caregivers looking for a portable high chair, though it could also be used right at home, too. The chair secures directly to tables using twist-tight couplings. Compatible with most tables, it takes just a few seconds to attach and comes off without leaving any marks. Once the chair is in place, you can position your baby in it, and they'll be sitting right at the table with the rest of the group.

When you're ready to leave or need to store the high chair, simply untwist it to release it. Then, you can collapse it flat and place it in the carry bag (included with each order). The Inglesina Fast Table Chair offers an integrated back

pocket for storing bibs, spoons, and other feeding essentials. You can purchase this portable high chair in 11 different solid color options, including Stone Gray Melange, Slate Blue Melange, Red, Dark Green, and Lime.

The Maxi-Cosi Minla High Chair converts to adapt to the changing needs of your baby or toddler. It offers a six-in-one design with nine different height options, five recline settings, and four different tray positions. With all of these options, it can be used for feeding infants, as a stand-alone high chair for a baby, a feeding booster, a dining booster, a dining high chair, a stool, or a comfy cushion.

This Maxi-Cosi high chair is designed to be easy to clean. The snack tray comes off and can be washed in the dishwasher, and the cushioned seat pad unzips for cleaning in the washing machine. When not in use, you can fold the chair to conserve space in the kitchen or dining room. Maxi-Cosi offers

seven different fabric color combinations for this high chair, including three "EcoCare" options that are made using recycled plastic bottles.

Between the 60-pound weight limit and numerous seating options, the Graco Blossom is a good pick for those who want a high chair that can support their baby into toddlerhood. It offers several different settings: infant high chair, traditional high chair, infant booster, toddler booster, and youth chair. Users can also adjust the height between six different positions, adjust the footrest between three different positions (or remove it entirely), and choose from three different recline options. The safety harness converts between a five-point harness and a three-point harness to match the needs of each child and seating position.

While the Graco Blossom doesn't fold for more compact storage, it does have front wheels and rear casters to make it easy to move about your space. The rear casters lock to keep the chair more stable and secure when feeding a baby. Additionally, this model features a leatherette seat pad that can easily be wiped down or even cleaned in the washing machine when necessary.

Cleaning a high chair doesn't have to be a chore, and the Boon Grub is designed to keep cleanup time to a minimum. In addition to having a removable and machine-washable seat pad, it also features a dishwasher-safe tray and a dishwasher-safe seat. Simply toss the mess your baby or toddler left from enjoying their meal in the dishwasher, and move on to everything else you need to take care of.

The Boon Grub is designed for use with babies around 6 months to children up to 6 years. It can support up to 50 pounds, has a five-position footrest, and features an adjustable tray. Plus, you can adjust the height of the high chair to match your table and lifestyle. Choose from table- or counter-height options. As your child grows older, the legs can be shortened and the tray can be removed, transforming the high chair into a toddler seat.

If you're looking to use baby-led weaning and want to teach your little one to feed themself from a very early age, consider the Abiie Beyond Junior Y High Chair. This model is one that Judy Delaware, occupational therapist, feeding specialist, and co-owner of Feeding Littles, which offers online courses for parents on baby-led weaning and feeding picky eaters, recommends for baby-led weaning. She explains that "the footrest can be brought up to reach most 6-month-olds' feet, and the baby can lean forward in the (ideal) positive tilt position to reach food." This European-cultivated beachwood high chair converts for continued use through the toddler years, and even into

adulthood. It takes only seconds to transform it from a high chair into a standard dining chair.

Delaware points out a few other benefits of the Abiie Beyond Junior Y High Chair. She says that it is "super easy to clean, slide up the table to avoid needing a booster, and comes in multiple colors (bonus)!" The chair comes in nine different wood and cushion color combinations.

The Bottom Line

When it comes to choosing the best high chair, there's no single product that will be the right fit for every family or every baby. To help you choose the right model, think about when you wish to start using the chair and how long you plan to continue using it. Additionally, consider whether or not you want your baby to eat right at the table with you, or if you prefer for them to be in a stand-alone high chair with a tray. Finally, the cost to purchase a high chair can vary widely, so be sure to keep your budget in mind as you shop.

Things To Consider When Buying High Chairs

Size and Weight: As you consider the various high chair options on the market, think about the size and weight of each model before making a final decision. Depending on how much space you have in your dining room or kitchen, some chairs will likely be a better fit than others. Consider where you will place the high chair for most feedings, but also keep in mind that you might want to be able to move it to other areas of the home as well. For example, if you are preparing dinner, you might decide to have your older babysit in the high chair to watch you in the kitchen. Or, you might choose to bring the baby into the living room to have a snack while you entertain guests.

The amount of space you have and how much you plan to move the high chair around your home can lead you to choose one with an appropriate size and weight. Some high chairs have a more portable or compact design. Models that strap onto a dining chair, for example, might be a better option if you want to be able to bring the high chair with you when traveling or visiting friends or family.

Foldability: Foldable high chairs can help conserve space, while still allowing you to purchase a full-size model for your baby. As the name suggests, these models fold down, reducing the amount of space they'll take up when not in use. If you're interested in a folding high chair, you'll also want to keep safety and stability in mind. Choose a model that can stand upright on its own so that it doesn't slide down or get pulled down as your baby gets older and begins moving around more on their own.

Convertibility: Many parents shop for a high chair when they are pregnant or have a very young baby. During this stage, it may feel like it's going to be an eternity before you have a toddler or an older child, but that time will come more quickly than you realize. As you're choosing the right high chair for a baby, think about whether or not you want it to be able to grow with your little one.

Delaware explains that convertibility and adjustability are two important features to look for when shopping for a high chair. She says, "We recommend high chairs that have adjustability, so that as the baby grows, so can the chair. And that high chair can go from a child using a tray to removing the tray and the child is pushed right up

to the family table to enjoy meals with the entire family." A convertible high chair may be more expensive, but it can save you money in the long run since you won't need to purchase a separate booster seat for your toddler.

Weight Limit: Take note of the weight limit for each high chair as you're shopping. High chairs are tested by the manufacturer to support the specified weight, but may not be safe to use with babies or toddlers who exceed the limit. To avoid a potential safety hazard, don't place a child in a high chair if they weigh more than what the manufacturer recommends.

You'll notice that weight limits vary rather significantly between some chairs. Some high chairs may only be tested to support up to 30 pounds, while others are designed to accommodate larger children or even adults weighing 200 pounds or more. If you're looking for a high chair that you can continue to use with a toddler or even an older child, then it will be especially important to choose one with a higher weight limit.

Safety: Grenawitzke highlights safety as something everyone should consider when shopping for a high chair. She says to "look for a stable chair that won't tip over easily and won't trip you or other caregivers walking around it." She adds that "Every year, more than 5,000 infants are evaluated in ERs after falling from a highchair in the U.S." Heavier chairs are more likely to remain upright than lighter-weight chairs. While wheels can make it easier to move a high chair around the home, make sure the wheels can be locked to keep the chair more stable.

In addition to choosing a sturdy chair that won't tip over easily, consider the chair's restraint system, or harness. While a three-point harness is the minimum required by ASTM International's safety standards, a five-point harness that goes over the baby's shoulders in addition to going around their hips can help with positioning and prevent them from accidentally falling out of the chair. Once you have your high chair set up for your baby, it may be tempting to leave them unbuckled and use only the tray to keep them in place, but this could increase the chance of an injury. So, always use the restraint system to prevent an accidental fall.

Care and Maintenance: Babies and toddlers are just learning how to eat. They lack the coordination that older children and adults have. They're also exploring different textures and tastes and learning about cause and effect. So, it should come as no surprise that they're likely going to make a mess – and possibly a big mess – during

meals. And, don't forget, they're going to be eating multiple times a day. For this reason, you might want to consider finding a high chair that's easy to clean and care for.

James King, an operations manager of Deluxe Maid, a professional house cleaning service in Indianapolis, Indiana, says to "use bibs or trays during meals to prevent spills from reaching the cushion." While bibs and trays will catch some debris, crumbs and sticky messes will still find their way to the seat itself.

Looking for high chairs with removable – or even dishwasher-safe – trays, machine-washable covers, and minimal crannies to hold crumbs can help make cleanup more manageable. Also, consider how easy the restraint system will be to wash since it will undoubtedly get covered with food at some point.

How We Chose the Best High Chairs

When selecting the best high chairs, we considered the input of two baby-feeding experts: Judy Delaware, an occupational therapist and feeding specialist and co-owner of Feeding Littles, and Kim Grenawitzke, an occupational therapist with Solid Starts. In addition to the insight they provided, we also consulted feedback from professional reviewers, looked at ratings from users, and made sure that our selections offered options to match a wide range of feeding needs, budgets, and other concerns. James King, the operations manager of Deluxe Maid, also helped us by providing information about cleaning and caring for high chairs.


