Blue-light blocking glasses help mitigate this effect by reducing the amount of blue light exposure before bedtime."

The NightFall Wayfarer Blue Blocking Glasses block more than just blue light. They also block green light, which is directly next to blue light on the color spectrum and can also disrupt the body's production of melatonin, according to scientific studies. The Nocturnal Red 550 Lens is able to block all blue and green light between 400 and 500 nanometers. These glasses can be customized with prescription or reader lenses to match your specific vision needs, but they're also available with nonprescription lenses for those who only require the blue- and green-light blocking capabilities. All the prescription and nonprescription options have red lenses.


The glasses offer an impact- and scratch-resistant design for lasting durability. The frames also have spring hinges to give them a wider range of motion and make it less likely that you'll accidentally snap the hinge when putting on or taking off the glasses. Each purchase comes with a foldable carrying case and a lens cloth.

With the Okany Blue Light Blocking Glasses, you can protect your eyes from harmful blue light and avoid interfering with your body's melatonin production without spending a fortune. The glasses cost less than \$20 and feature yellow-tinted lenses to absorb blue light. They also have a lightweight frame made from ultraviolet-treated (UV-treated) polycarbonate plastic. The material is shatterproof, durable, and easy to clean. The glasses also have an anti-reflective coating to further protect your eyes and help you see clearly when wearing them.

These glasses can benefit anyone who spends time in front of a screen at night, but they're designed for gaming. Their shape, with large square lenses, is compatible with most gaming headsets and won't block your field of vision or interfere with your ability to play your favorite games. The unisex design can be worn by anyone. However, you cannot get these with prescription lenses.

If you're looking for prescription blue-light blocking glasses, then take a look at the Warby Parker Armando Glasses. Choose from four different lens types: single-vision, progressives, readers, and nonprescription. The lenses are made from polycarbonate, an impact-resistant material. They're further protected with anti-reflective and scratch-resistant coatings. Plus, Warby Parker offers a free replacement for scratched prescription lenses within six months of the purchase date.

The Armando frames are made from durable stainless steel. You can choose either a Polished Gold or Polished Silver finish depending on your preferences. The frames also feature silicone nose pads to help keep them in place on your nose. Each purchase comes with a frame case and a lens cleaning cloth.

If you're a glasses wearer, you don't necessarily have to buy prescription blue-light blocking glasses. Instead, these Fitover Night Swannies easily mount to your existing frames. They're lightweight for comfortable wear.

These glasses, which feature anti-reflective coatings, are designed to block between 99% and 100% of blue light in the evening to help you get better quality sleep – simply put them on an hour or two before bedtime, and take them off once you're ready to hit the hay.

Swanwick also makes Fitover Day Swannies, which are better suited for continuous wear throughout the day. Unlike the Night Swannies, however, the Day Swannies aren't intended to help with sleep.

The Bottom Line

Some turn to blue-light glasses to help them achieve better quality sleep. As Dr. Devika Bhushan, a physician and public health leader based in California, explains, blue-light blocking glasses "block the blue wavelengths of light that wake our brains up." We chose the Block Blue Light NightFall Wayfarer Blue Blocking Glasses as our top pick because they block both blue and green light, they're scratch- and impact-resistant, and they're available with both prescription and nonprescription lenses, making them suitable for many users. Whether you're looking for a standard pair of glasses or need a prescription option, you should be able to find a pair that suits your needs on our list.

Things To Consider When Buying Blue-Light Blocking Glasses

Comfort and Fit: The blue-light blocking glasses you purchase won't be able to deliver any benefits if you don't actually wear them. For this reason, you'll want to prioritize comfort and fit when deciding which pair to purchase. Look for lightweight frames. Also, no one wants to continuously push glasses back up over their eyes, so you may want to opt for a pair with a nonslip nose piece. When possible, try the glasses on before making a purchase. You want them to feel snug without being so tight that they hurt your ears or head.

Prescription Option: Some blue-light blocking glasses are available with prescription lenses, while others aren't. If you wear prescription glasses, especially for computer work, then you might want to look for a pair that can be customized to your precise vision needs. Otherwise, you may need to wear the blue-light glasses over your existing prescription glasses. This can feel cumbersome, and you may not wear the glasses enough to really benefit from their blue-light blocking capabilities.

In some cases, you may be able to have blue-light blocking technology integrated into a pair of prescription glasses. Carter shares, "Many optical stores and online retailers offer blue light-blocking technology in prescription lenses. This allows individuals with vision correction needs to benefit from both blue light protection and improved visual acuity." However, if you're looking for a darker-tinted pair of blue-light blocking glasses, then you'll likely want to have two separate pairs.

Style and Aesthetics: As with any pair of glasses, you want to choose one that fits your style. Everyone has different preferences when it comes to frame shape and color. While some prefer a thin frame with small lenses, others prefer thicker frames with larger lenses. Similarly, some like plastic frames, while others would rather have a metal frame.

Purchasing glasses online can be tricky because you're not always able to see how the glasses actually look on you. Some retailers offer a virtual try-on feature to help customers see how they'll look in different glasses. This may be a feature you want to look for when shopping.

Additional Features: Consider whether or not there are any additional features you want to see in the glasses you purchase. Carter recommends looking for blue-light blocking glasses with an anti-reflective coating. He says that this "can help reduce glare and reflections, providing a clearer view and minimizing eye strain."

He also suggests making "sure the glasses also offer protection against ultraviolet (UV) rays, as prolonged exposure to UV light can contribute to eye damage."

How We Chose the Best Blue-Light Blocking Glasses

To help us curate our recommendations for the best blue-light blocking glasses, we reached out to experts: Trent Carter, founder, licensed nurse, and family nurse practitioner at Curednation, and Dr. Devika Bhushan, a physician and public health leader based in California. In addition to considering their input, we looked into feedback from professional reviewers and ratings left by everyday customers. Our final list includes recommendations to match different styles, prescriptions, and budget needs.
