

In Sydney, Australia, Bill O'Brien and Harry Norville launched a brand called Breville (a combination of both founders' surnames) in 1932. Breville started out selling radios until it changed gears in 1972. Focusing instead on kitchen appliances, the brand introduced the Scissor Action Snack 'n' Sandwich Maker, a toasted sandwich maker. Since then,

Breville has expanded its product line to include espresso makers, coffee grinders and brewers, countertop ovens, mixers, blenders, and juicers.


Dedicated to innovation, the brand introduced the first juicer capable of crushing whole fruits and vegetables. Five different Breville models make our rating of the Best Juicer of 2023, which is more than any brand.

The Breville Juice Fountain Cold Plus ties for first place in our Best Juicers of 2023 list. Professional reviews note that it's a great choice for those interested in making large quantities of juice, with its fast juice extraction rate and high capacity. Its large jug holds 70 fluid ounces and includes a sealing lid in case you want to store leftovers.

This juice extractor is also a good fit for those who prioritize saving time. It's a centrifugal juicer, which finely chops ingredients and spins them through a strainer to extract the juice. Centrifugal juicers operate faster than masticating models (some of which are called cold press juicers), which slowly grind and press juice out of produce. This Breville model has a 3.5-inch-wide feed chute, meaning you can toss whole fruits and vegetables into the machine without pre-cutting them.

While some prefer masticating juicers for their cold press function, the Breville uses proprietary Cold Spin Technology. This is how Breville refers to the design of its Juice Fountain Cold models which aim to minimize heat buildup that some believe decreases the nutritional value of fresh juice. The Breville Juice Fountain Cold Plus is not a cold press juicer.

This model features a dual-speed setting: slow (for softer produce like citrus fruits) and high (for harder fruits and vegetables such as mangos and carrots).

For those short on countertop space, the Breville isn't an ideal option. Many reviewers mention the bulkiness of this machine.

As another downside, experts also note how this model produces froth. If you prefer foam-free juice, your best bet is a masticating juicer, which processes at a low speed.

What Comes With a Breville Juice Fountain Cold Plus?

Constructed from brushed stainless steel, the Breville Juice Fountain Cold Plus comes with a 70-ounce juice jug with a built-in froth separator, a detachable spout, and a cleaning brush. To save space, its pulp container is positioned at the back of the juicer's base.

Additionally, Breville's nozzle is designed for easy serving. It dispenses juice directly into your glass so there aren't any spillages.

Also, the unit's extra-large jug is equipped with a sealing lid, allowing you to store extra batches of juice in your refrigerator for up to three days.


How Much Does a Breville Juice Fountain Cold Plus Cost?

The Breville Juice Fountain Cold Plus costs \$279.95. Of all the other centrifugal models we evaluated in our Best Juicers of 2023 ratings, there's only one that's pricier: the Breville Juice Fountain Elite (\$299.99).

While the price tag of the Breville Juice Fountain Cold Plus is steep compared to other centrifugal juicers, it's worth noting that masticating models tend to be less budget-friendly. For instance, the most expensive one to make our list sells for \$599.99.


Breville Juice Fountain Cold Plus vs. Breville Juice Fountain Cold

Compared to the Breville Juice Fountain Cold Plus, which costs \$279.95, the Breville Juice Fountain Cold has a price tag of \$199.95, making it a more favorable option for those on a budget.

Both centrifugal juicers use Cold Spin Technology, which helps to minimize heat transfer. They also include a juice jug with a high capacity (70 fluid ounces), a plus for those who plan on making large batches of juice. Another benefit is the wide chutes that mean both juicer machines can tackle whole fruits and vegetables. Both appliances also feature an LED light that indicates when the motor is being overloaded.

The biggest difference between these very similar juicers is their power. The Breville Juice Fountain Cold has an 850-watt motor, while the Plus model is equipped with a faster 1,000-watt motor.

Omega Ultimate Juicer and Nutrition System »



Breville Juice Fountain Cold Plus vs. Omega Ultimate Juicer and Nutrition System

The Breville Juice Fountain Cold Plus tops our Best Juicers of 2023 list, tying at No. 1. The Omega Ultimate Juicer and Nutrition System ties for the seventh spot in our rating. The Omega (\$349.95) is also more expensive than the Breville (\$279.95). Keep in mind, the Omega is a masticating model, which is often pricier than centrifugal juicers like the

Breville. Masticating juicers operate at a slower speed which reduces heat buildup, which is why some masticating models are called cold press juicers. Thus, the Omega is a better choice for those who prefer cold pressed juice. On the other hand, the Breville faster speed may be a plus for those who don't want to spend a lot of time juicing.


In addition, the Breville's 3.5-inch feed chute is 2 inches wider than the Omega's, allowing it to fit whole fruits and vegetables. The Omega requires more prep work because you have to chop the ingredients before inserting them into the machine.

The Omega, however, is a more versatile machine. Besides juicing, it can perform other tasks, including grinding coffee beans, producing nut butters and milks, and making frozen desserts. It also comes with a more generous warranty (15 years) than the Breville's one-year offer.

The Breville Juice Fountain Elite operates with a 1,000-watt motor to produce more juice than most centrifugal models. It uses a sharp titanium-reinforced blade and a micromesh filter to optimize the amount of juice and nutrients extracted from produce.

Ideal for larger households, the Breville holds one liter of juice and 3.2 quarts of pulp. Its feed chute has a big mouth, which will save you time on prep work because instead of having to cut ingredients beforehand, this device can handle whole produce.

While the Breville has two power settings (low speed for softer fruits and leafy vegetables, high speed for denser produce), some experts say it performs better with fruit than it does with greens. For those interested in making green juices, a masticating model would be a better choice.

Although it has convenient storage features, including a detachable pulp container and a power cord that fits under its base, this juice extractor isn't suitable for those with a smaller kitchen because it takes up a lot of counter space.

For budget-conscious shoppers, it's worth mentioning that this juicer is the most expensive Breville model in our Best Juicers of 2023 list. It costs \$299.99, which also makes it the priciest centrifugal model in our ratings. However, some reviewers believe it's worth the price because Breville's removal components are dishwasher safe, making for fast, easy cleanup.



What Comes With a Breville Juice Fountain Elite?

Equipped for making large quantities of juice, the Breville Juice Fountain Elite includes a 1.1-quart juice jug with a built-in froth separator, as well as a 3.2-quart pulp container. It also comes with a cleaning brush for scrubbing hard-to-reach crevices.


The Breville is constructed from premium materials. For instance, its interior is made from stainless steel to prevent stains and cracks and it uses a titanium-reinforced disk and an Italian-made micro-mesh filter to produce a high juice yield. The Breville's food pusher guides whole fruits and vegetables down the product's feed chute. Another handy feature: it has an LED light to warn users about overloading the device.

How Much Does a Breville Juice Fountain Elite Cost?

The Breville Juice Fountain Elite has a price tag of \$299.99, making it the most expensive centrifugal juicer in our Best Juicers of 2023 list. It's also the priciest Breville model we evaluated. While the most affordable centrifugal juicer in our ratings costs \$90.96, the masticating models in our list range between \$189.95 to \$599.99.

Kuvings Whole Slow Juicer »



Breville Juice Fountain Elite vs. Kuvings Whole Slow Juicer


The Kuvings Whole Slow Juicer, which costs \$599.99, is pricier than Breville Juice Fountain Elite by \$300. In fact, it's the most expensive juicer in our rankings.

One of the major differences between these two units is their model type. The Kuvings is a masticating juicer, while the Breville is a centrifugal extractor, a type of juicer that is usually more affordable.

The Breville is a better fit for families because it has a high juice yield, as well as a large juice jug and pulp container. Additionally, the Breville has more power and speed, as its 1000-watt motor spins at up to 13,000 revolutions per minute. The Kuvings, which has a 240-watt motor, processes much slower (360 RPMs). The Kuvings also offers a more generous warranty (10 years) compared to Breville's one-year coverage. More than just a juicer, the Kuvings model can produce nut milks, frozen desserts, and smoothies.

Hurom H-AA Slow Juicer »


Since masticating juicers are usually steeper in price than centrifugal models, it's not out of the ordinary that the Hurom H-AA Slow Juicer costs nearly \$250 more than the Breville. A better choice for larger households, the Breville produces twice as much juice as the Hurom.

However, the Hurom stands out from the Breville because it's more versatile. In addition to juicing, this model can also make ice cream, tofu, and nut milks. While professional reviewers point out the Breville's bulkiness, the Hurom is compact and sleek in design. It's also available in trendy colors, including rose gold, white, and matte black. The Breville only comes in brushed stainless steel.

Ideal for those with limited room for kitchen appliances, the Breville Juice Fountain Compact is smaller than the brand's other models included in our Best Juicers of 2023 list. While most centrifugal juicers feature a separate pulp container, this machine collects pulp around the edge of the strainer basket, a design that conserves counter space. Additionally, its power cord can wrap around the unit's base for convenient storage.

Though this model is compact, it features an extra-wide feed chute that can fit whole fruits and vegetables, which spares you the prep time of pre-cutting ingredients. It's made from premium materials, including stainless steel blades, an Italian-made micromesh filter, and a steel locking arm for safety.

The Breville compact juice fountain, however, is not the best option for families because it doesn't produce a large amount of juice. Compared to the other Breville models in our ratings, its 24-ounce jug holds the least amount of juice. Another downside: it only has one setting, which some professional reviewers describe as loud.

But, price-conscious shoppers may want to take into account that this unit is the cheapest Breville model we evaluated. At about \$100, it's also one of the most affordable juicers to make our rankings.

What Comes With a Breville Juice Fountain Compact?

The Breville Juice Fountain Compact is constructed with a simple, three-component design, making it easy to clean and assemble. It comes with accessories such as a juice jug with a built-in froth separator, as well as a cleaning brush that can be used on its micro-mesh filter.


The Breville Juice Fountain compact stands out from the brand's other juicers because it doesn't have an external pulp container. Instead, this unit's pulp bin is integrated into the machine, which saves space. Additionally, its cord wraps around a raised disc in the base of the unit for convenient storage.

How Much Does a Breville Juice Fountain Compact Cost?

The Breville Juice Fountain Compact costs \$99.95. It's the cheapest Breville model to make our Best Juicers of 2023 list and it's also one of the most affordable units overall. Only one juicer in our rankings has a lower price tag: the Mueller Ultra-Power Juicer, which only costs about \$10 less.


Similar in price, both the Breville Juice Fountain Compact and the Mueller Ultra Power Juicer are centrifugal models that don't take up a lot of counter space. Both of their feed chutes measure three inches in width, meaning you can place whole produce into the machine without having to cut it down to size.

But, the Breville outranks the Mueller in our evaluation. It ties at No. 4, while the Mueller places in the 11th spot, tying with the NutriBullet Juicer Pro. The Breville, which has a higher juice capacity, has a 25-ounce jug, while the Mueller's holds 16 ounces.

Unlike the Breville, the Mueller comes with two motor settings: a lower speed for softer ingredients, and a higher speed for harder produce.

Smeg Citrus Juicer »



Breville Juice Fountain Compact vs. Smeg Citrus Juicer

The Breville Juice Fountain Compact and the Smeg Citrus Juicer are both small machines, which is great for those who don't have a ton of counter space. A citrus press, the Smeg performs one function: juicing citrus fruits. The Breville, on the other hand, is more versatile in that it can handle both fruits and vegetables.


The Smeg ties for the top spot in our Best Juicers of 2023 list, outranking the Breville, which ties at No. 4. The electric citrus juicer comes with a stainless-steel strainer that eliminates seeds and pulp, a plus for those who prefer pulp-free juice.

Since the Smeg isn't a centrifugal juicer like the Breville, it operates at a slower pace. It has an 80-watt motor, while the Breville's has 700 watts of power. Notably, the Breville is a better choice for those on a budget, as it's \$90 cheaper.

If you're looking for a large-capacity juicer, the Breville Juice Fountain fits the bill. It can produce up to 70 ounces of juice at once. The unit's juice jug comes with a seal, allowing you to keep fresh-squeezed juice in your fridge for up to three days. In addition, the Breville's pulp container is large in capacity (3.6 quarts), which means you can make batches of juice without the interruption of emptying the bin frequently.

Centrifugal juicers like the Breville are known for producing juice quickly. Some people prefer masticating models instead because they produce smoother juice by slowly grinding and squeezing ingredients rather than shredding them. However, this Breville Juice Fountain model stands out from other centrifugal juicers because of its proprietary Cold Spin Technology, which aims to reduce heat buildup. Note that the Juice Fountain Cold is not a cold press juicer.

The Breville is equipped with a dual-speed setting: high speed to tackle harder fruits and vegetables, and a lower speed for accommodating softer ingredients. That said, professional reviewers mention that, like most centrifugal juicers, this machine does a lackluster job of processing leafy greens. For those who plan on purchasing a juicer to

make kale or wheatgrass shots, a masticating model would be a better choice for that purpose.

What Comes With a Breville Juice Fountain Cold?

The Breville Juice Fountain Cold is supplied with accessories such as an Easy Seal juice jug with a built-in froth separator, a detachable spout, and a cleaning brush. The unit's nozzle functions to dispense juice directly into your glass without spilling. Meanwhile, its brush makes it convenient to clean the unit's filter mesh. To prevent unsafe operation, the juicer's LED light signals when the machine is being overloaded. The juicer's interlocking arm was also designed with safety in mind as it stops the machine from processing if the cover isn't locked into place.


How Much Does a Breville Juice Fountain Cold Cost?

The Breville Juice Fountain Cold costs \$199.95, which is on the higher side for a centrifugal model. The others we evaluated range in price from \$90.96 to \$299.99, with most selling for more than \$100.

Of the five Breville juicers in our Best Juicers of 2023 list, two are more budget-friendly: the Juice Fountain Compact and Juice Fountain Plus.




Both the Breville Juice Fountain Cold and the NutriBullet Juicer Pro tie at No. 11 in our Best Juicers of 2023 ranking. This Breville model produces around 40 ounces more juice than the NutriBullet, making it a better choice for families. However, for those short on counter space, the NutriBullet is the more compact option.

Both centrifugal juicers also feature wide feed chutes that fit whole fruits and vegetables, which eliminates the need to chop the ingredients beforehand, a perk for those looking to save on prep time. Similar to the Breville, the NutriBullet's juice jug comes with a sealing lid, so you can store extra juice in your fridge to have at another time. However, the NutriBullet includes glass to-go bottles, as well as freezer trays. It's also \$40 cheaper than the Breville.

Hurom HP Slow Juicer »





Breville Juice Fountain Cold vs. Hurom HP Slow Juicer


More expensive than the Breville Juice Fountain Cold by about \$175, the HP Slow Juicer is one of the priciest models in our Best Juicers of 2023 list. Since it's a masticating juicer (which usually costs more than centrifugal units), it operates at a slow pace (43 revolutions per minute) and uses an auger to squeeze juice from fruits, vegetables, and leafy greens rather than shredding blades.

While the Hurom isn't ideal for shoppers on a budget, its motor comes with a generous 10-year warranty. Breville's warranty only covers a year. The Hurom is also more compact, which is great for those with limited kitchen space. But, the Breville is a better bet for those who want to make larger quantities of juice as it can hold 70 ounces, which is much greater than the Hurom's 27-ounce juice yield.

Breville Juice Fountain Plus Review

Breville Juice Fountain Plus »



Ranked #4 in Best Juicers of 2023 (tie)

Best for:

Not recommended for:

- Those shopping for a cold press juicer
- Those who plan on juicing leafy greens

The Breville Juice Fountain Plus is a centrifugal juicer that's built with an 850-watt motor. It's crafted from premium materials, including a polymer body, as well as stainless steel cutters and an Italian-made micro-mesh filter that Breville says allows the appliance to extract more vitamins and minerals than other juicers.

The Breville uses mostly dishwasher-safe components (except for its lid and food pusher), which makes for easy cleanup. For safety, it has a steel arm that prevents the machine from operating unless its cover is locked into place. It also features an LED light to warn users when the juicer is being overloaded. Like the other Breville models we evaluated, this unit boasts an extra-wide feed chute that accommodates whole fruits and vegetables, which means you don't need to spend time pre-cutting ingredients.

Though it offers two speed options (low for more delicate produce, and high for denser ingredients), some professional reviewers say it tackles fruit better than it does leafy greens, particularly kale.

This model differs from the Breville Juice Fountain Cold and Juice Fountain Cold Plus because it doesn't include the brand's Cold Spin Technology, which prevents heat buildup. However Breville's Cold Spin Technology does not make these juicers the same as cold press juicers, also called slow juicers, which use a different mechanism to extract juice.

What Comes With a Breville Juice Fountain Plus?


The Breville Juice Fountain Plus comes with a 1.1-quart juice jug (with a built-in froth separator) and a 2.6-quart pulp container, both of which allow the machine to produce a large quantity of juice at once. Since its 3-inch feed chute is wide enough to fit whole fruits and vegetables, a food pusher helps to guide the produce so it doesn't clog the juicer. This model also includes a nylon bristle brush to assist with cleaning the unit's micro-mesh filter basket. For convenient storage, the Breville's cord can wrap around its feet and clip into position under its base.

How Much Does a Breville Juice Fountain Plus Cost?

The Breville Juice Fountain Plus costs \$159.95, which is a reasonable price compared to the other models in our Best Juicers of 2023 list. Of the five Breville juicers to make our ratings, only one is cheaper than this unit: the Juice Fountain Compact. Its price tag is \$60 less, but it also has less power and produces a lower quantity of juice. For those looking for a centrifugal juicer for less than \$100, the Mueller Ultra-Power Juicer, which sells for \$90.96, is the most affordable option included in our rankings.

Smeg Citrus Juicer »



Breville Juice Fountain Plus vs. Smeg Citrus Juicer

The Smeg Citrus Juicer ties at No. 1 in our Best Juicers of 2023 list, while the Breville Juice Fountain Plus ties at No. 7. The Smeg, which costs \$30 more than the Breville, only handles citrus fruits. The Breville, on the other hand, can tackle both hard and soft produce. Its wide feed chute allows you to insert whole fruits and vegetables into the juicer. With the Smeg, you have to cut the citrus into halves before pressing it onto the reamer.

Known for its compact, stylish design, the Smeg is packed with handy features for citrus juicing. Its drip-stop spout prevents countertop spills and its strainer attachment is ideal for those who prefer pulp-free juice. Plus, it comes in a handful of colors, including black, cream, pastel blue, pastel green, pink, red, and white, making it suitable for people who go through a lot of citrus juice and want an attractive appliance.

The Breville, however, is a better option for people who intend on making large batches of juice, citrus, or otherwise. A more heavy-duty machine, it has 850 watts of power, and its juice jug can hold one liter of liquid. Additionally, it has a large pulp container (2.6 quarts), which means you won't have to interrupt your juicing session to clear out pulp.


Breville Juice Fountain Plus vs. Breville Juice Fountain Cold

The Breville Juice Fountain Plus and the Breville Juice Fountain Cold share some similarities: an 80-watt motor, two speed settings, an extra-wide feed chute, a safety locking arm, as well as an LED light for overload protection. Alike in price tag, the Breville Juice Fountain Plus costs \$40 cheaper.

However, the Juice Fountain Cold is more suitable for people who want to make large quantities of juice. It has a 70-ounce juice jug that can hold 35 ounces more liquid than the Juice Fountain Plus' vessel. Additionally, its pulp container is larger than the Juice Fountain Plus' by a whole quart.

The main factor that sets the Juice Fountain Cold apart is its Cold Spin Technology, a feature that prevents heat buildup. Note that this feature does not make it a cold press juicer.



You can also purchase them from major retailers, including Macy's, Kohl's, Best Buy, Walmart, as well as homegoods stores like Williams Sonoma, Crate and Barrel, and Bed Bath & Beyond. The brand's juicers are also available on Amazon, Food52, and QVC.



Does Breville Offer a Money-Back Guarantee?

Breville offers customers in the United States a money-back guarantee within 30 days from when they received their product. As part of their return policy, they only accept appliances bought directly from the company's website. Additionally, the machine must be in brand new condition and accompanied by its included accessories and packaging. Before initiating a return, contact Breville to obtain a Return Authority (RA) number.

Does Breville Have a Warranty?

All Breville products are covered by a limited one-year warranty. Keep in mind: the company advises that you don't return the juicer to the store where you purchased it. Instead, look for the appliance's sales receipt, as well as its product number, batch code, and serial number (usually found on a sticker, or molded underneath or on the back of the product). Then, with this information at hand, contact Breville and the company will arrange to have your original juicer returned to them and deliver a replacement to you at no cost.

How Do I Use a Breville Juicer?

The five Breville juicers that made our rankings are all centrifugal models with wide feed chutes. Since these units can handle whole produce, you save the step of cutting the ingredients down to size.

First, wash the fruits and vegetables and remove the leaves of vegetables like beets and carrots. Plug the machine into an outlet and, if your juicer comes with two speed options, select the most suitable speed ("low" works best for softer fruits and vegetables, "high" is meant to tackle harder produce). While the motor is spinning, insert ingredients into the feed chute, guiding the produce down with the food pusher. To get the most juice, push this component down slowly. The processed juice will then flow into the juice jug, while the separate pulp will filter into the pulp container.

How Do I Clean a Breville Juicer?

Straightforward in design, Breville juicers tend to be easy to clean. That's because most of their parts are dishwasher safe. The specific parts vary by model, but generally, you can load the unit's pulp container, juice jug, and micro-mesh filter basket in the top rack of your dishwasher. Always double-check your user guide to see which components are dishwasher-safe and which must be hand-washed.

For components that aren't safe to place in the dishwasher, rinse them in warm, soapy water, removing wet pulp, and then dry with a soft cloth. Breville juicers include a bristle brush, which comes in handy for cleaning stubborn stains, as well as the juicer's mesh basket (if you opt to not put it in the dishwasher).

To save time on cleanup, it's a good idea to line your pulp container with a produce bag. The juicer's motor base can be wiped down with a damp cloth, just make sure it's completely dry before starting it up again.
