
What Is Omega?

Omega Products Inc., which was first called Olympic Products, has specialized in juicers since its start in 1985. The company boasts a robust lineup, including centrifugal and masticating juicers, as well as citrus juicers.

However, Omega is most known for its masticating juicers, one of which is the Omega Ultimate Juicer and Nutrition System, which ties at No. 7 in our Best Juicers of 2023 list. Besides juicers, Omega makes other kitchen appliances such as blenders, food prep machines, and drink dispensers.

The Omega Ultimate Juicer and Nutrition System stands out from other juicer machines because of its versatility. In addition to juicing hard and soft fruits, vegetables, and leafy greens, the Omega can produce nut butters and milks, grind coffee and spices, mince garlic and herbs, and make pasta, frozen desserts, and baby food.

The Omega costs \$349.95, making it one of the priciest juice extractors to place in our Best Juicers of 2023 list. If you're only interested in juicing fruit, you may be better off purchasing a centrifugal juicer which tends to be much cheaper.

Like all masticating juicers, this horizontal model functions at a low speed to prevent heat buildup. While centrifugal models take less time to juice thanks to their high-speed blades, masticating juicers use cold-press technology to better preserve health-boosting enzymes and antioxidants from fruits and vegetables. Cold-pressed juice also has minimal froth.

It's worth noting that the Omega's Triple Stage masticating process extracts the maximum amount of nutrients from produce. Another upside of this feature: it results in a high volume of juice. Fruits and vegetables are first crushed within the machine's drum. Then, the pulp is squeezed again to yield any remaining juice. The Omega is equipped with automatic pulp ejection, meaning pulp collects into the bin located in the back of the juicer, which makes for easy cleanup.

However, professional reviewers mention how the Omega's small feed chute requires precutting fruits and vegetables into small pieces before placing them into the machine, which is a drawback for those looking to save time on food prep.

What Comes With an Omega Ultimate Juicer and Nutrition System?


The Omega Ultimate Juicer and Nutrition System comes with a juice cone, a homogenizing cone, six nozzles, a juice bowl, a pulp bowl, and a strainer. The unit is called a nutrition center because its attachments allow the machine to tackle tasks beyond juicing. For instance, different cones and nozzles equip the machine to perform various functions, including grinding coffee and making pasta. Its adjustable end cap includes three pressure settings for maximum juice output and extraction. Although the Omega produces minimal froth because of its slow speed, its strainer works to further reduce any from seeping into the juice.

How Much Does an Omega Ultimate Juicer and Nutrition System Cost?

The Omega Ultimate Juicer and Nutrition System has a price tag of \$349.95. Compared to the other units in our ranking of the Best Juicers of 2023, this is one of the most expensive. Keep in mind, masticating machines, also called slow juicers, are typically steeper in price than centrifugal models. Most masticating juicers in our ratings are pricier than the Omega, including the Hurom HP Slow Juicer (\$379), the Hurom H-AA Slow Juicer (\$439), and the Kuvings Whole Slow Juicer (\$599.99).

The Breville Juice Fountain Elite places at No. 3 in our Best Juicers of 2023 list, while the Omega Ultimate Juicer and Nutrition System ties at No. 7. Since it's common for centrifugal juicers to be more affordable than masticating models, it's no surprise that the Breville costs about \$50 less than the Omega.


The Omega, however, is capable of more functions. Both juicers tackle hard and soft fruits and vegetables, but the Omega can also produce nut butters and milks, as well as grind coffee beans, mince herbs, and make frozen desserts and baby food.

The Breville is a better choice for those who prioritize saving time. It operates at a fast speed and its large feed chute allows you to place whole fruits and vegetables into the machine. With the Omega, you'd need to chop the produce before feeding it into the juicer because it has a smaller chute.

Ideal for those invested in the health benefits of juicing, the Omega preserves the nutrients from the food it crushes because its cold-press process prevents heat buildup.

Omega Ultimate Juicer and Nutrition System vs. Hurom H-AA Slow Juicer

The Omega Ultimate Juicer and Nutrition System and the Hurom H-AA Slow Juicer are both masticating juicers, meaning they extract juice through slow grinding, a method that prevents heat buildup and better preserves the antioxidants and vitamins from fruits and vegetables. Similar to the Omega, the Hurom serves other purposes beyond juicing. For instance, it can make ice cream, tofu, nut milks, and sorbets.

The Omega outranks the Hurom in our Best Juicers of 2023 list, tying at No. 7. Meanwhile, the Hurom takes the ninth spot. With a price tag of \$439, it's nearly \$100 more expensive than the Omega. Plus, compared to the Hurom's ten-year warranty, the Omega comes with longer coverage (15 years).

A more aesthetically-appealing choice, the Hurom, which is built from BPA-free plastic, is known for its sleek design. Additionally, it's available in multiple color options (matte black, white, rose gold), while the Omega only comes in silver.






Omega FAQ

How Do I Buy an Omega Juicer?

Omega juicers can be purchased from the manufacturer's website. They're also sold through other online platforms such as Amazon or Wayfair. For those who prefer an inperson experience, Omega juicers are available at major department stores, including Macy's, Target, Walmart, Kohl's, Home Depot, and Bed Bath & Beyond, as well as others.

Does Omega Offer a Money-Back Guarantee?

Omega offers a 30-day return policy. Before returning a product, the company advises you to call their toll-free hotline so a customer service representative can provide you with a merchandise authorization (RMA) number. Customers are responsible for covering pre-paid shipping costs. Omega credits customers for returns through the same method as their original payment (credit card, debit card, cash, etc.)

Does Omega Have a Warranty?

Omega products are backed by a 15-year warranty, a generous offer that exceeds the industry standard. Most of the juicers we evaluated only include a one-year warranty.

This warranty doesn't apply to products damaged by improper usage or everyday wear and tear. Also, customers must cover the shipping fee for any replacement part they need delivered. The company doesn't assume responsibility for warranty claims made on products purchased or used outside of North America or any of the United States territories.

How Do I Use an Omega Juicer?

Omega masticating juicers come with lots of parts, making them more complicated to use than centrifugal models, which tend to be more streamlined in design. But, the Omega's different attachments allow for a wide range of functions, whether it be making frozen desserts, grinding coffee, or pureeing baby food.

Since its feed chute has a small opening, you'll need to chop produce into small pieces before juicing. While the Omega requires more prep time than centrifugal models, it's equipped with handy features to ease the process. For instance, it has a built-in reverse function to dislodge any potential food clogs.

Typical of masticating models, which are sometimes referred to as cold-press juicers, the Omega performs at a low speed (80 RPM, to be exact) to prevent nutrients from oxidizing. This method also ensures minimal froth, and, while it takes longer to operate than centrifugal models, the juice from this machine can be stored for up to 72 hours without sacrificing any of its nutrients or flavor.

How Do I Clean an Omega Juicer?

Masticating juicers have a reputation for being difficult to clean. Experts, however, mention that this isn't the case for the Omega. Unlike centrifugal juicers, there's no blade to clean. Instead, all of its parts are dishwasher safe. A cleaning brush, which is included with the product, helps remove hard-to-reach food buildup within the machine's feed chute, drum, and juicing screen.

To clean the juicer, start by disassembling the unit. Then, rinse its components under cold water first and then use warm soapy water. If you'd like to use a dishwasher instead, place the Omega's parts on the top rack for cleaning.
